APPOINTMENTS

7:05 p.m. - Dave Rooke, Mt. Elgin Recreation Grant Presentation

David Rooke, on behalf of the Mt. Elgin Recreation Committee, presented the 2019 grant request from the Committee to Council. He commented on the t-ball that is ongoing at the park now and stated that it is great to see the kids out using the park. Discussion also took place regarding the need to reconfigure the ball diamond to make it more symmetrical. The Committee would like to have funds to do this in the future.

Mayor Mayberry thanked Dave for his presentation and advised that Council will begin budget deliberations in another month.

7:15 p.m. - Barb Freeman and Graham McGregor Mt. Elgin Cemetery Grant Presentation

Graham McGregor and Barb Freeman presented the financials for the Mt. Elgin Cemetery to Council. Graham noted that it was a challenging year for the cemetery due to the need for increased grass cutting. The cemetery only had one interment and only one cremation plot was sold. It was noted that one grass cutting costs the cemetery \$250; the board was criticized by the community for not cutting the grass early enough in May.

Discussion took place regarding the care and maintenance fund that is required to be maintained. 40% of cemetery plot revenue is provided to the Township to invest in future care and maintenance. It was noted that the board has received few inquiries regarding the purchase of plots. It is estimated that there are enough plots in the cemetery for another 75 years based on how many are sold each year now.

7:45 p.m. - Jennie Schmitt, Ingersoll Skating Club

Jennie Schmitt, on behalf of the Ingersoll Skating Club, presented their 2019 grant request to Council. She advised that the skating club's registrations are down compared to where they have been in the past. They would like to branch out in the Township more, do some targeted advertising in the Township, and possibly sponsor a family in South-West Oxford.

She commented that the club is not just for kids, it is for the whole family. The club continues to try to do as much fundraising as they can.

In response to an inquiry by Councillor Pickard, it was noted that there are approximately six families from South-West Oxford involved with the skating club currently. The club has approximately \$10,000 in GICs. The club has increased their fees, however in order to stay competitive with surrounding clubs they are not able to raise them too high. They will also be approaching the Town of Ingersoll to request funding.

7:25 p.m. - Lorraine Granham and Carol VanMoerkerke, Dereham Hall Grant Presentation

Carol VanMoerkerke, on behalf of the Dereham Hall Board, presented the board's financial statements for 2018 to Council and the 2019 grant request. She noted that the board received a little more in grant money than they were expecting in 2019 and have seen a rental income increase compared to previous years. The board had 49 rentals throughout the year and continues to support the 4-H club by allowing them to use the hall free of charge.

The board has decided not to redo the chimney, and instead would like to convert to natural gas which will also eliminate the need to redo the chimney. The chimney will come down when natural gas is put in. They would also like to convert to a natural gas water heater to reduce some operating expenses. The board estimates that all of this will cost approximately \$9,000.

The board would like to purchase a picnic table with steel legs for the park. Staff can check to see if there are any for sale on Gov Deals. Staff will also follow up with NRG with respect to when the hall may be converted to natural gas. The board is also working on getting some trees donated to be planted at the park to give the area some shade.

7:35 p.m. - Sheila Fleming, Ingersoll Nature Club

Sheila Fleming on behalf of the Ingersoll Nature Club made a presentation to Council with the club's 2019 grant request. She commented on the removal of phragmites that has been ongoing at the nature reserve. The club would like to purchase a piece of equipment to help them with the remove of the phragmites. Phragmites are a huge problem around this area, removing them will help to restore the natural environment.

NEW BUSINESS (continued)

Airport Road/Zenda Line

Council discussed the condition of the Airport as a result of a complaint that was received by Council and staff. Adam Prouse explained that the Township is on a three-year rotation for resurfacing; roads were fall graded this past Friday, however we have had a lot of rain. Staff are spot grading the worst roads.

8:30 p.m. - Adam Prouse, Hilltop Park Grant Request

Adam Prouse, on behalf of the Hilltop Park Committee, presented the 2019 grant request. He commented on the soccer that is taking place for little kids in the area; there is no registration, kids are able to come out and play. Operating expenses for the park are expected to stay the same in 2019; 10% has been added for grass cutting.

Adam advised that the park committee has applied for Trillium funding for a new playground. They expect to hear in the New Year if they were successful or not. It was noted there is \$30,000 available from the Township in reserves. If the Trillium application is not successful, the Committee would like to use the money from the Township to get something in the park in 2019. Sidewalks will be needed in 2020 to have access to the park.

Discussion took place regarding the development charge reserve fund. Treasurer Diane Larder advised that she could bring a report to Council on the balance within the development charge reserve.

8:45 p.m. – Al Forrester and David Lucas, Mt. Elgin Community Hall Grant Request

Al Forrester, on behalf of Mt. Elgin Community Hall, reviewed the 2019 grant summary and five-year capital plan for Council. He commented that the funds received from fun day are intended to be spent on fun day the following year. There are additional funds remaining from the Canada 150 event which the committee would like to spend on a future public event.

The Committee discussed the final costs for paving the parking lot and how the final costs will be shared between the committee and the Township. It was noted that in the past the costs are shared based on the estimate, not the actual costs. The paving has come in higher than originally estimated; the budget was \$68,000 and costs have been invoiced to date in the amount of \$71,000. Line painting in the parking lot is still required. A report will come forward to Council with respect to the extra costs for the parking lot in December.
