



BALE WRAP RECYCLING PROGRAM

Effective July 3, 2006, the Oxford County Landfill will be accepting agricultural bale wrap for recycling.

There will be no charge to drop off this material at the landfill as long as the loads are clean, segregated loads of bale wrap. Any load found to have other material mixed in will be charged the tipping fee for the entire load.

Benefits:

- Eliminates the environmental hazard of burning and burying bale wrap
- Farmers have an easy way to help recycle what was once a waste for disposal
- There are no tipping fees for clean segregated loads of bale wrap

Requirements:

- Must be WHITE 100% linear low-density polyethylene film only
- Bundles should weigh no more than 2-4 kgs each
- Material does not need to be washed however, please shake the material to eliminate excess dirt, rocks and stones
- Do not tie the material with twine or put into bags
- Other types of plastic material used by the farming community (i.e. clear fertilizer bags, feed pails, shrink wrap, black material used on pig farms) are **NOT** recyclable at this time
- Residents are responsible for unloading of all material into the designated collection area.

Landfill Information:

The Oxford County landfill is located east of the village of Salford at 384060 Salford Rd. (County Rd. 46)

Hours of Operation

Monday-Friday, 8:00am -4:30pm

Saturday, 8:00am-4:00pm

Closed on Sundays and all statutory holidays.

The Highway Traffic Act requires all users of the Oxford County landfill to securely tarp or cover their load during transit.
